On the 19th of August 2007 at Seoul Station in Korea the Katipunan ng mga samahang Migranteng Manggagawa sa Korea (KASAMMA-KO) the Migrante International in Korea founding member of the International Migrant Alliance (IMA) joined the other migrant workers from Nepal, Bangladesh, Sri Lankan, Indonesian with the strong solidarity from the Korean workers showed their anger and outrage to the ongoing crackdown and deportation being done by the Korean government to the undocumented migrant workers since August 1, 2007.

The program started at 2:00 pm a wherin all the leaders from different migrant associations demonstrates their angriness and frustrations against the crackdown policy of the Korean government. Mr.Kajiman the President of the Migrant trade Union (MTU) said The Crackdown Policy is the worse policy in Korean history, it should be stopped right away, instead of deportation the Korean government should legalized the migrants who had sacrifice for more than ten years in the Difficult, Dirty and Dangerous Job thus kept the Korean economy become more competitive.

It was augmented by Utoy the representative from the Katipunan ng mga Samahang Migranteng Pilipino Sa Korea (KASAMMA-KO) he said the inhumane crackdown and deportation is rooted in the Imperialist, and capitalist systems supported and nurtured by the state. Likewise these system have consequently perpetuated anti workers and anti migrant structures.

To stop this inhumane crackdown and deportation we should organize ourselves bind ourselves together break the barriers of nationalities to steadfastly challenge the system. They also got the solidarity from the E Land workers in Korea and from the International Delegates from different countries that would have an international forum on August 21-22 at the KCTU office.

They marched the downtown seoul and kept on shouting "Stop Crackdown No one is Illegal. Legalize all undocumented Migrant Workers, Long Live International Solidarity. The march ended at the historical MyeongDong Catholic Church.
